Recent News

Avalon Motel Townhouses: This townhouse development to be built by City Ventures at the site of the Avalon Motel has been approved and demolition is beginning. This will be a welcome improvement to our neighborhood, but there may be added pressure on neighborhood traffic and the local parking situation as a result.

December 2015 and July 2016 NSNA Meetings

NSNA held two recent neighborhood meetings:

December 2015: The December North Shoreview Neighborhood Association meeting speakers included: San Mateo Mayor Joe Goethals, Anna Kuhre, and Ben Toy from SMUHA, Catherine Zammit from the San Mateo Department of Public Works. The passage of Measure S and what it would mean to the Flood Zone was discussed.

July 2016: Brad Underwood, Director of Public Works was the main speaker at this recent NSNA meeting. He provided an update on the Flood Zone Improvements. Police Lt. Rick Passanisi updated us on neighborhood safety (which has improved and is minimal compared to other areas). Jeff Philliber, heading up the North Shoreview Traffic Steering Committee also gave an update. It was a very informational meeting.

North Shoreview Flood Control Improvement Status

Things are finally moving forward! Measure S was passed last October extending the city's ¼ cent sales tax and providing the funds necessary to pay for the majority of the infrastructure projects needed to remove our neighborhood from the FEMA flood zone. North Shoreview will supplement this amount with a Neighborhood Assessment District, where we will need to pass and pay an additional homeowner tax — the amount to be determined but estimated to be approximately what the Shoreview Neighborhood passed in 2012 and is paying. The NSNA will be leading this effort and we expect to begin in the fall to coordinate the timing of the new tax with our removal from the flood zone.

The design is 90% completed and the city is getting the necessary permits for the work. Construction is anticipated to begin summer 2017 and will take approx. 18–24 months.

San Mateo Traffic Forums: Traffic Steering Committees

The City of San Mateo completed citywide traffic forum meetings and has started on the next steps for the ongoing efforts to improve the quality of life in the neighborhoods and North Shoreview has created a Traffic Forum Steering Committee (TFSC). This committee will now come up with the top 10 traffic concerns and present it to the city. Each neighborhood will then receive a postcard with these top concerns and have an opportunity to vote and reprioritize the TFSC's top 10 traffic concerns. Results will be returned to the TFSC and the City will schedule a meeting to begin development of neighborhood Traffic Management Plan (TMP). San Mateo Police Community Contact
